The Industrial Pretreatment Program (IPP) Inspector responsible for conducting various inspections, reviewing reports and correspondence, and answering calls related to IPP.

Key Responsibilities:

- Conducts annual inspections of Industrial Users and Significant Industrial Users. Monitors Industrial Users, Significant Industrial Users, and Contract Cities.
- Performs meter reading and sludge responses.
- Reviews Self-monitoring Reports and general correspondence.
- Performs preparations for fieldwork, including preparing paperwork and equipment. Cleans and repairs equipment. Maintains assigned vehicle.
- Answers telephone calls related to IPP, providing information and assistance. Performs weekly task review.
- Issues permits and provides enforcement of IPP regulations and guidelines. Participates in technical training.
- Attends safety meetings and work on special projects as requested.
- Performs related duties as assigned.
